NEW: GSA Providing Automatic 180-Day Extension of Expiring Entity Registrations in SAM.gov

The U.S. General Services Administration is working to support implementation of many aspects of the American Rescue Plan Act. GSA's Integrated Award Environment specifically is working to administer relief for certain entities already registered in SAM.gov in order to do business with the government.

To help reduce burden, there will be a 180-day extension for SAM.gov registrations that have expiration dates ranging between April 1, 2021, and September 30, 2021. This effort is intended as relief for those otherwise required to re-register during that time frame. This does not impact entities registering for the first time during this time period. No action is required on the part of registrants.

Each entity registration will have 180 days added to its expiration date. As an example, an entity that is set to expire on April 1, 2021 will be automatically granted an extension to September 28, 2021. Continue Reading

Single Sign-in For Government Services Expands to States, Localities By Andrea Noble, Nextgov staff

The U.S. General Services Administration is looking to partner with state and local governments to offer user authentication and identity verification services for users of federally funded programs.

<u>Seventeen</u> federal agencies use the Login.gov website to offer secure and single sign-in services and the expansion would allow state and local governments to utilize it for federal programs administered at the local level, including Medicaid and Medicaid managed care plans. Through <u>Login.gov</u>, users only need one account and password to

access the participating federal services.

The coronavirus pandemic has underscored the need for agencies to simplify the process of obtaining government benefits and services at the state and local level, a GSA spokesman said.

"Login.gov's user-friendly, secure service is an ideal solution to help people get access to those resources during the time they need it most," said spokesman Matthew Burrell in an email response to questions about the program. Continue Reading

NIST Seeks Small Business to Help Develop Cybersecurity Standards By Mariam Baksh, Nextgov

The National Institute of Standards and Technology is in the market for a company to support its work crafting privacy and cybersecurity standards for critical technology that will apply to federal agencies.

In a recent notice posted to the government's procurement website, the agency listed standards development for areas including cyber-physical systems, cloud computing and virtualization, and privacy engineering and risk management as a high-priority in a time of heightened cybersecurity awareness following widespread breaches of the public and private sector. Hackers were able to penetrate the defenses of federal agencies by leveraging access they gained through the network management company SolarWinds and other means.

"With a new and re-energized national emphasis on information security, the NIST Information Technology Laboratory's Computer Security Division is uniquely positioned to ensure that new technology initiatives are selected, deployed, and operated in a manner that does not increase the risk to organizational missions, individuals, and the Nation," the sources sought notice reads.
