ARC Accepting Second Round of Area Development Applications

Pennsylvania, Each year Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) provides funding for numerous projects in the Appalachian Region in a wide range of program areas. The projects funded in the program areas create thousands of new jobs, improve local water and sewer systems, increase school readiness. training, assist local communities with strategic planning and provide technical support to emerging businesses.

Pre-applications for Proposals are due on March 31, 2022.



Eligibility

Eligible ARC applicants:

- Local Development Districts
- States, counties, cities or other political subdivision of a state
- Institutions of higher education
- Public or private non-profit organizations or associations

Eligible Projects and Activities:

- Technical assistance
- Infrastructure development (site preparation, water, sewer, broadband, etc.)
- Local government assistance
- Development of multi-tenant facilities
- Destination or asset-based tourism

2022 Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan Candidate Project Listing

The Southern Alleghenies RPO will act as a clearinghouse for bicycle and pedestrian projects of significant quality and value to the Region. The projects chosen for the Candidate Project Listing will be based on how the project supports the goals and objectives of the 2022 Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan. Projects in this listing have been appropriately vetted by the RPO and their status will be determined to be one of the following categories:

- Initial Projects in this phase are generally very conceptual at this point
- <u>Early Developmental</u> Projects in this phase have a clearly demonstrated need and multiple components showing there has been some planning for the project.
- <u>Advanced Developmental</u> Projects in this phase are well developed and show a clear and documented need.

Once a project is selected and placed on the list, sponsors can and should tout that fact in competitive grant applications. It is expected that this selective process will be a

resource for local, state, and federal agencies (i.e., PennDOT, DCNR, DCED) looking to fund well developed and quality projects.

The RPO will begin accepting proposals to be placed on the Candidate Project Listing on March 1, 2022.

Southern Alleghenies Mini-Grant Program



SAP&DC is happy to announce Round 8 of the Southern Alleghenies Regional Greenways Mini-Grant Program. The program is intended to provide funding for projects that support the implementation of the overall goals that have been identified in the 2007 Southern Alleghenies Greenways and Open Space Network Plan and the 2022 Southern Alleghenies Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan.

Grant Guidelines

Grant requests shall be a minimum of \$3,000 and a maximum of \$30,000. All grantees must be able to provide a cash/eligible non-cash (in-kind) contribution of at least 50 percent of the total project cost. Any applicant that currently has a project open with the SAP&DC Regional Greenways Mini-Grant Program is not eligible to apply for Round 8 funding.

Eligible Applicants include:

- Counties and Municipalities
- Council of Governments (COGs)
- Conservation Districts
- Land Trusts
- Non-profit Organizations
- Housing/Redevelopment Authorities
- Designated Heritage Areas

Eligible Projects include, but are not limited to:

- <u>Development</u> Protection or improvement of natural areas, development of new or existing trail development, signage, equipment
- <u>Planning</u> Feasibility studies or trail/site master plans
- <u>Technical Assistance</u> Educational workshops, walking and biking maps for trail users, and community walking/biking programs

The application period will be announced in March 2022 and applications will be due by May 27, 2022. SAP&DC will also be holding a Greenways Mini-Grant Workshop for potential applicants where SAP&DC staff will go over the guidelines of the program and answer any questions on applications and the grant process.
