Registering to do Business with the Government

This checklist has been created to assist you in completing the registrations required to do business with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (CoPA) and the Federal Government. Please note: while completing the below registrations is required for government work, it is not a guarantee of future government sales.

Simply follow these nine easy steps to complete the registrations required for government contractors. Upon completion, maintain this checklist as a record of your registrations, as it will be necessary to reference this information in the future.

4) Pennsylvania Supplier Portal

If you wish to do business with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, you must first register your business as a supplier with the PA Supplier Portal.

The easiest way to register is online at www.pasupplierportal.state.pa.us. Simply click on "New Supplier Registration" on the left side of the page to begin your registration. Upon completing the registration process, you will be assigned a six-digit vendor number. This number is required to bid on state contracts.

Note: You should register with the Supplier Portal as a "procurement supplier."

It is also important to know the various industry classification codes that describe your products or services in the Federal arena. You will need the following industry classification codes to complete your required Federal government registrations.

Identify Your Product and/or Service Codes for the Federal Government

5) North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Codes

NAICS Codes (pronounced 'nakes') are six digit codes used to classify businesses into particular industries or economic activity. You may find that more than one NAICS code describes your business, so it is best to identify all of your relevant codes.

6) The Federal Supply Classification (FSC) (FOR COMMODITIES ONLY)

FSCs are a commodity classification codes used to describe items or commodities sold to the government. The FSC utilizes a four-digit coding structure. The first two digits of the code number identify the group, and the last two digits identify the classes within each group.

The following information represents the government registrations that are required if you wish to do business with the Federal Government. Please complete the registrations in the order listed below. You will need your DUNS Number, which was created in Step #2 to complete the below registrations.

8) Central Contractor Registration (CCR)

If you wish to do business with the Federal Government, you must have an active registration in the Central Contractor Registration or CCR. Registration is free and can be done online at www.ccr.gov. It is necessary to renew/update your CCR registration last least once per year.

Before you begin your registration, it is good to review the **CCR User's Guide**, which is found online at https://www.bpn.gov/ccr/doc/CCRUsersGuide.pdf. The CCR User's Guide lists all of the information you

will need to have available in order to complete your CCR Registration.

Upon conclusion of the registration process, you will be assigned a Commercial & Government Entity (CAGE) Code and you will have created a Marketing Partner Identification Number (MPIN).
